### **Operation:**

During the Easter Weekend Operation Los Planes and Leonor Meza Martinez Middle School participate. The purpose of this outreach is to provide campers visiting our bay with trash bags and encourage them to use portable toilets and trash bins. We distribute bags on foot and by boat during the four most celebrated days of the holiday.







### **School Visits**

During our school visits, we meet weekly with 12 groups to discuss conservation, pollution, and environmental care. Each classroom in the elementary and middle school have a module where they separate the

plastic they produce. Meanwhile, the high school has separation modules for plastics, bottle caps, aluminum, and glass located throughout their campus.

We invite all students to participate in outings and/or immersive and educational workshops.
